

Minor in History (24 credits)

This program applies to all who entered the History Minor **<u>between Fall 2015 and Winter 2022</u>** (inclusive). Anyone entering the History Major after that date will follow the new program (see the document "History Minor 2022").

The History Major established in 2015 requires 24 credits, distributed in this way:

| 6 Credits | History Skills Workshop courses (HISW) – see note below |

The General Education Rule and the History Minor
