

## Joint Specialization in English and History (60 credits)

This program applies to all who entered the Joint Specialization in English and History <u>between Fall</u> <u>2015 and Winter 2022 (inclusive)</u>. Anyone entering the Joint Specialization after that date will follow the new program (see the document "Joint Specialization in English and History 2022").

The Joint Specialization in English and History established in 2015 requires 60 credits, distributed in this way:
